



BT is offering a free taste of superfast broadband to businesses in Glasgow.

The trial is part of the telco's ongoing investment in fibre infrastructure in the UK. Back in 2008 BT announced it would be spending £1.5bn to bring fibre broadband to around 10 million homes and businesses by 2012.

BT business customers in the Glasgow Halfway exchange area are being offered the chance to trial fibre to the cabinet (FTTC) broadband, the telco said yesterday. The service offers download speeds of up to 40Mbps and upstream speeds of 2Mbps. The fibre service will be free until the end of March 2010.
